The Covid-19 crisis and related shutdowns have forced many businesses to quickly introduce remote working protocols. In these kind of circumstances cyber-criminals can exploit a lack of training or preparation. A new <u>article by Beale</u> <u>& Co</u> provides information on some of the new types of cyber-attack being employed by cyber-criminals and what defences firms can put in place to ensure they are best protected.

# **Coping With Coronavirus**

Dr Brendan Kelly's new e-book, *Coping with Coronavirus: How to Stay Calm and Protect your Mental Health*, focuses on managing the anxiety and panic triggered by coronavirus around the world. Addressing these challenges involves people making changes to behaviours, managing information from the media, dealing with thoughts and emotions and addressing self-identification in a new and different world. Practical tools are provided to assist in navigating the current crisis and uncertain days ahead. The e-book is now **available for purchase** for 99c and royalties from sales will be donated to medical charities assisting with the coronavirus response.

# New European Commission Work Scheme

The European Commission has introduced a new scheme for temporary Support to mitigate Unemployment Risks in an Emergency (SURE). This initiative is designed to help protect jobs and workers affected by the coronavirus pandemic. It will provide financial assistance in the form of loans granted on favourable terms from the EU to Member States, of up to €100 billion in total. These loans will assist EU member states to address sudden increases in public expenditure to preserve employment.

# **Recent Covid-19 Good News**

- The Intel Foundation is donating €500,000 to Irish charities to support coronavirus relief and recovery efforts. The foundation is also matching donations made by employees to the Crumlin Children's Hospital, Alone and Jigsaw.
- An Post is launching a <u>new service</u> where family members can request that local postworkers check in on elderly or vulnerable people while they are cocooning. A free newspaper delivery service is also being provided.
- <u>Serosep</u>, with headquarters in Limerick is a leading manufacturer of laboratory diagnostic products. Recently the firm developed a new molecular diagnostic testing product, which reduces by 25% the time needed to identify the virus.
- The Irish National Opera (INO) plans to collaborate with researchers from DCU's Science Foundation Ireland Insight Centre for Data Analytics to create an <u>operatic work using new immersive</u> <u>technologies</u>. The project is part of a Europe-wide Horizon 2020 project.
- Currently it takes more than 60 minutes to clean a room with a CT scanner. Irish start-up firm <u>Akara</u> <u>Robotics</u> is working with Irish hospitals to cut this time down to less than 15 minutes. A new robot design has been developed to emit ultraviolet light clinically proven to rapidly kill viruses, bacteria and germs.
- Two essential builds are currently underway in Co. Limerick to make Covid-19 isolation step-down facilities that will ease the burden on Ireland's hospitals. 24 units are under construction and are due to be completed within 14 weeks.
- Distiller William Grant & Sons is supplying five million litres of ethanol for hand sanitiser production. The Scottish firm is being helped in this by colleagues at its plants in Girvan and <u>Tullamore.</u> All profits made from the sale of ethanol will be re-invested into actions that will help to alleviate the spread and impact of the virus.
- The World Health Organisation (WHO) has launched <u>OpenWHO</u>, a free, open-access learning platform for health emergencies. Courses are provided by public health experts about topics including Covid-19 and infection prevention.
