ACEI Correspondence to Local Authorities

Two letters were recently sent out by ACEI to local authorities on behalf of members. The first, to Limerick City and County Council (LCCC) addressed concerns relating a tender requirement that has been introduced for full time secondment of staff to work in LCCC's office and be available to council staff for two years e.g. ref August 2022 LCCC Active Travel Public Project via eTenders.

The second letter, to Dun Laoghaire Rathdown County Council, (<u>DLRCC</u>) was in relation to its Taking in Charge Development Standards: Certificates of Compliance. ACEI continues to engage with public clients on a regular basis, feedback regarding public procurement processes is welcome from members.

ACEI Secretary General Panel Member at Build Digital Conference

ACEI Secretary General, Sarah Ingle participated in an industry panel at the first <u>Build Digital</u> Conference that took place in Dublin on 26 October. An opening address by Minister Michael McGrath, DPER, set the scene, speaking about how the Build Digital Project aims to transform the Irish construction and built environment sectors. The <u>five pillars</u> of the project will enable all stakeholders, particularly SMEs, clients, and suppliers, to develop, maintain, and continuously improve their capabilities as digitally enabled, standards-based, agile, collaborative, and sustainable participants in the delivery of Project Ireland 2040. During this successful hybrid event, feedback was provided from the industry in relation to its digital needs arising from responses to the recent build digital survey.

Build with Wood Conference

The Department of Agriculture, Food and the Marine and Coillte are hosting a conference entitled: *Build With Wood - The Pathway to Net Zero*. Creating a Circular System for the Built Environment

As <u>COP27</u> begins this week, it is important to note that the built environment sector is a huge consumer of cement, aluminium, steel, and plastic, four of the five materials which account for 55% of the world's industrial carbon emissions. All involved in the industry need to address reducing these emissions by a variety of means, including embracing the principles of a circular economy.

To achieve a net zero transition, it will be necessary to strengthen the supply of and access to 'circular material' on a global scale. In a <u>recent article</u>, circular material is defined as that which is pre-used, low or/zero-carbon, recyclable or recycled.
